## Synopsis

The energy is trapped in a newly crafted spirit vessel, sealing the entity away once more.

Emrys collapses, blood seeping from his eyes, nose, and mouth. He is alive, but barely. The Wicca elders decide that he, too, must be imprisoned, ensuring that neither he nor the Ripper can ever threaten their world again.
